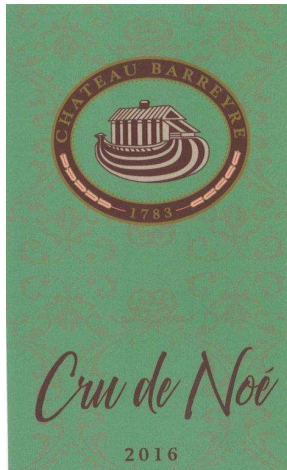


CHATEAU BARREYRE “CRU DE NOE”

BORDEAUX SUPÉRIEUR



Chateau Barreyre is a small, 9-hectare property near the old port of Macau on the Garonne that actually lies within the Haut Medoc, close to the border of the Margaux appellation. Due to its proximity to the Garonne and the higher clay content of the soil, Ch. Barreyre is only entitled to the appellation Bordeaux Supérieur. In 2016, Ch. Barreyre purchased 5 hectares of vines adjacent to its own vineyards known as the “Cru de Noé” or the “Cru of Noah.” The Cru de Noé was cited in the 1823 edition of the Bordeaux “bible” Bordeaux and Its Wines by Cocks and Ferret. 2016 is the first release of the new Chateau Barreyre “Cru de Noé,” produced by vineyard consultant Claude Gaudin and winemaker Etienne Jacquard.

Vinification and Èlevage: Selection by vineyard parcel; sorting table; total destemming; fermentation in stainless steel. Pump over 3 times per day. 12 months èlevage, 30% in barrique and 70% in stainless steel.

Tasting Notes A full-bodied, succulent wine with a velvety texture, Cru de Noé displays plenty of dark berry fruit, fine ripe tannins and a long, creamy finish. This silky-smooth wine shows the quality that a Bordeaux Supérieur can achieve through meticulous work and lower yields in the vineyard.

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
