Château Laroque Margaux



Château Laroque is one of the few remaining independent châteaux left in the Margaux appellation, as many properties have been bought by larger classified châteaux. Owner Eric Leglise is a working vigneron, not an aristocratic gentleman farmer, even though his vineyard plots are interspersed with those of prestigious classified châteaux such as Ch. Rauzan-Ségla, Ch. Du Tertre and Ch. Monbrisson. Typical of Margaux estates, Château Laroque is a small property producing an elegant wine of great finesse. Château Laroque offers all the charm and delicacy that has made Margaux wines famous throughout the world.
