DOMAINE DE CRISTOL Côtes de Provence Rosé



Domaine de Cristol is part of the La Vidaubanaise cooperative which was founded in 1912. Situated on the slopes of the crystalline Maures Massif and the limestone foothills of the Pre-Alps, the area is well-suited for cultivating Mediterranean grape varieties such as Grenache, Cinsault, Syrah, Carignan and Mourvèdre. One wine is produced here, bottled in an elegant flute bottle that is a striking, modern expression of the traditional Provençal flute à corset.

Vinification and Élevage: The grapes are directly pressed to extract pale color. Fermentation is temperature-controlled in stainless steel tanks. Bottled in late February after the harvest.

Tasting Notes: The wine is characterized by a delicate salmon pink color and offers aromas of wild strawberry, white peach, citrus zest, and subtle floral undertones. The wine is crisp and refreshing on the palate with a balanced acidity, showcasing flavors of red berries, pink grapefruit, and hints of minerality follow by an elegant and lingering finish. Perfect as an aperitif and pairs well with Mediterranean cuisine, grilled seafood and meats, Niçoise salad, light pasta dishes, and fresh goat cheese.



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
